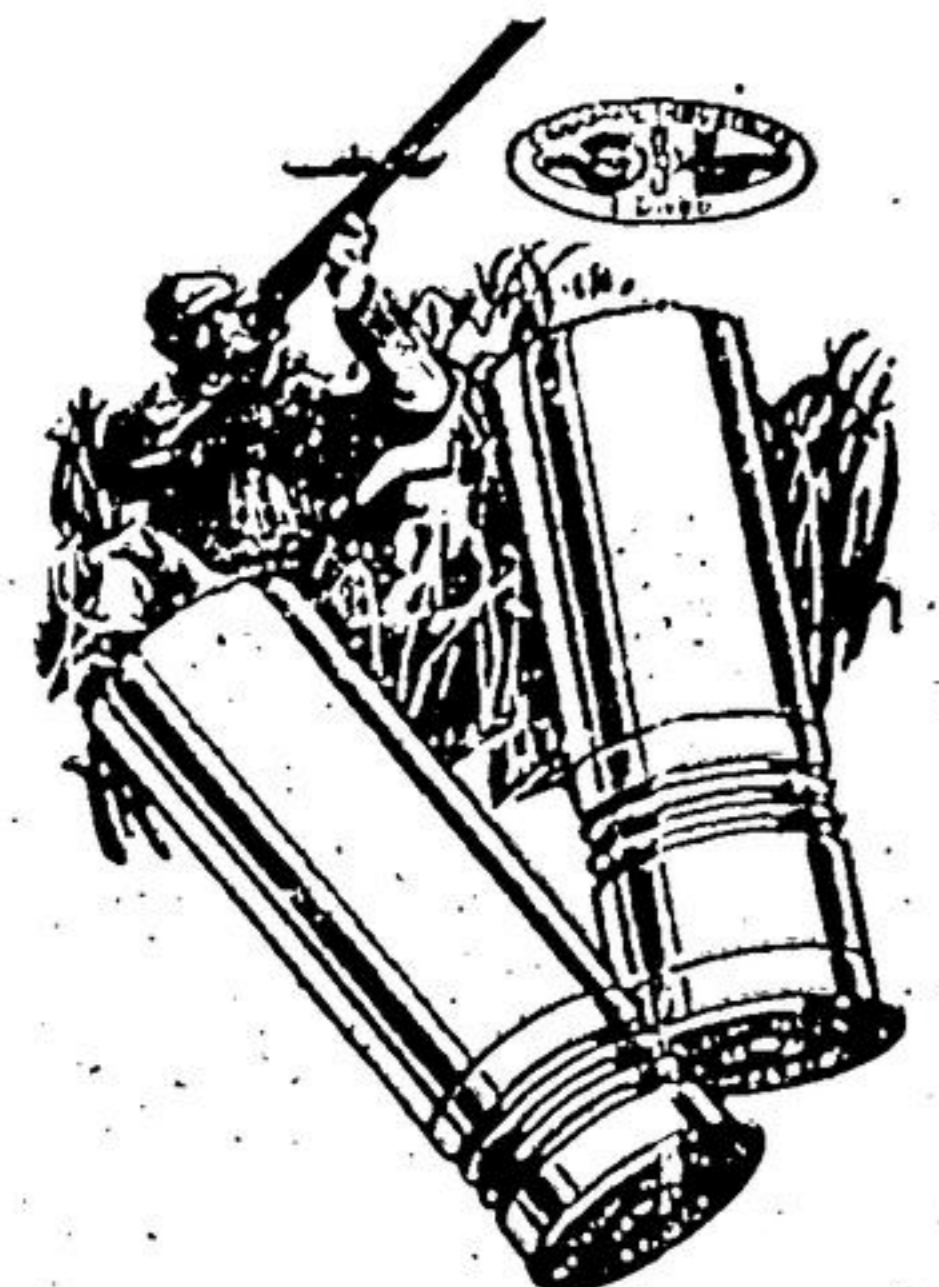

The Bandmaster's salary for one whole year, is the band worth \$250 to you? Would it be worth your while to collect for the band, donate \$25 and be pleased to think you were a supporter of an organization that has advertised your town from almost one end of the province to the other? We Bandmen realize that money is scarce, and we also realize that there is considerable mismanagement as to what the money is spent on. It might be wise to mention that most of the bandmen are moneymakers, and we wouldn't ask for anything if it was going to cost what some farmers here would cost us. Another item that has been discussed considerably among the ratepayers of this community and the people in general is, the fact that we are a Regimental Band, and the Regiment should pay the salary of the Bandmaster. As a word of explanation I would like to state what the Regiment is doing for us, a few facts that seem to be overlooked by the average person. First of all we are asked by the Regiment to play at three days in the summer, then in the fall they again ask us to appear at the Regimental Band inspection, which brings our duty with them for the year up to three and one half months. In the past days we are expected to give them three and one half days, leaving 36 1/2 days as they have to be on hand for any local engagements, or if you like a citizens' band with the honor of having the name of The Lorne Rifles (Scottish) Regimental Band, which in itself is worthy of a thought. In return for the three and one half days service we render to the Regiment we receive approximately \$200 in full as salary, which is a very campy entry on which has prompted us to have you as ratepayers, who as the next election on whether you give us the Bandmaster's salary or not, which is \$250 per annum, and you as ratepayers, you would give \$50 to pay
