Dortt fish are huge rays of the family Mantidas, which have a lossingeshaped disk broader than long, with the head free from the partoral fina and provided with a pair of anterior processes and the tall long and whiplike. The two genera and als or saven species are confined to warm seas. The best-known species are M. birostria, cometimes called the blanket fich by tropical American pearl fishers. from their belief that it attacks and devours men after enveloping them in its great wing-like pactoral figs, which reach a breadth of 50 feet.
