Tom Wilson is dead. Path-finder, trail-blazer, hunter, trapper, prospector, Indian trader, who explored and mapped the west coast and coast of the Canadian Rockies guide, the last of the pioneers, Tom Wilson, died at his home in the Happy Valley, B.C., on Sunday, Jan. 7, 1934.

For the Busy Farmer

Making Strawberries In many districts it is the practice to muck strawberry plantations with rye straw which, as it is harvested early, is very dry.

Order Fertilizer Early

Plants as much as animals require food. Winter is a good time to plan the summer crop. Manure supplemented with superphosphate is a splendid ration for most crops.

Wider Meaning of Sheep

Sheep do not require expensive and warm coverings. They do, however, appreciate a dry, cozy shed well situated and free from draught.

Winters May Feeding

Winter feeding requires different methods from those ordinarily found successful in summer. Stomping and crushing are common during the winter and result largely from an over-supply of heavy feeds.

Simple Methods for Younging Milk

The simplest and cheapest method for controlling mastitis is by the use of a weak iodine solution (0.5 to 0.8 per cent) kept in the udder between milkings.
