

Canadian Haney The United Kingdom ranks second to Germany as the world's honey market. From the standpoint of Canadian bes-keepars, however, the United Kingdom is easily the more important of the two. Honey imports by the British Isles have ranged between seven and ten million pounds yearly to recent years and have not shown the drastic decline which cheracterized German imports during the depression period. Up until 1926 the United Kingdom drew its honey supply from three main sources-United citates, British West Indies and New Zealand.
