THE OCEAN'S DEPTH.

The World's Highest Mountain Could the Lost In It. It is estimated that 63 per cent, of ocean area is desper than two and one-half miles. The amount of water in the oceans is \$63 millians of cubic miles, or thirteen times the volume of all the land above see level. Southeast of Tokio, 145 miles, a depth of \$3,836 feet, or \$.18 miles, has been recorded. Mount Everet, the highest mountain, rises \$9.6.)2 feet above see level, and would therefore sink \$,636 feet beneath the waves if placed at that deepest apot. The areas of sea bottom which its more than 18,000 fest below the surface are known as deeps. These deep spots occupy about nine milites square miles.
