Ottawa, February 28th—New bank legislation overhauled everything that has been done in the past. The central bank has followed the lines of the Marillon report but the new measure is far more sweeping and radical than most observers thought it would be. The theory—held in some quarters—that the government would give close heed to the minority suggestions of the banker members, and would in general modify the changes to conform with the ideas of the banking fraternity, was completely exploded by the actual bill. Momentous changes are introduced into the whole monetary credit and banking structure of Canada.
