Dehorning Cattle Experience has proved the great advantage from every standpoint of dehorning commercial cattle, and a great benefit would accrue to the live stock industry if all commercial cattle. were dehorned. Every effort should therefore be made to attain this object, and it more than merits the active support and co-operation of the press, and all institutions and organizations interested in the live stock industry to encourage the practice of dehorning all horned commercial cattle between March 15 and April 15 or during the month of October.


