The house was built by Charles Kennedy, a son of the first permanent settler, and is the first permanent dwelling, built in this section and to dedicate the same. The occasion of the present gathering is to commemorate the centennial of the first permanent settlement in the County of Halton. CONSERVATIVE AND LIBERAL CANDIDATES IN THE FIELDS IN HALTON COUNTY FOR ELECTION MAY 31ST

The 1854 Provincial election will be the third which the Conservative Government has contested since 1823 and the first since Hon. G. S. Hearn assumed office as Premier in 1922. The present administration, under Premier Howard Ferguson, was elected to office on October 30th, 1929. Nominations for the forthcoming election will be held on Tuesday, June 19th.

The Redistribution Act of 1923 which reduced the membership of the Legislature from 117 to 90, is now in operation and returning Officers have been chosen for 80 ridings of the Province.
