### County Tax Rate Reduced

At a county council meeting at Milton, 50 mills for general expenditure and 7-10 mills for county road purposes was fixed as Halton tax rate for 1934.

The levy shows a reduction of \$100,000 compared with 1933 and at present the county is paying \$1,000,000 less than last year. The settlement of the debt has been reduced \$180,000 since 1933.

The recent reorganization of the municipality by Hon. A. W. Harkness came in for lengthy discussion, and a motion was passed that the change would for the first time in the history of Halton, deprive the county of a possible increase in revenue. A motion of protest was ordered forwarded to the Attorney-General.
