An Appeal to Householders and Power Users of Hydro

The rates for power to the Georgetown Hydro Commission have been raised considerably and the cost this year will be nearly \$2500. extra. This will certainly mean that there will be a deficit unless some saving can be made.

The amount of power used between the hours of five and six p.m. during the winter determines the amount the Commission must pay, as at this time the street lights are on and the factories still running.

The rates to the homes are low in Georgetown and they would be the first to be raised. In order to avoid any necessity to raise these house rates, the Commission appeals to Customers not to use any appliance that they can do without during the hour from five to six p.m. The co-operation of the ladies at this hour will mean a big saving to the Commission and will avoid any need to raise the rates.




CLEAN AND STERILIZE
ALL DAIRY UTENSILS

The keeping quality of milk de-pends directly upon the number of bacteria present and this in turn debacteria present and this in turn depends upon the throughness with which dairy utensils have been cleaned and sterilised. The use of live steam or scalding with boiling water is always effective providing it is available in sufficient volume out as a general rule the quantity available on the average farm is inadequate for effective results. It is for this reason that the use of chlorine in suitable form is recommended by bacteriological experts. It sots rapidly n cold water, and is cheaper and more convenient than the heat treatment generally recommended. When propely employed chlorine sterilization gives excellent results and the practice, already general among milk and other food plants, is spreading to the dairy plants, is spreading to the dairy
