Where Loyalists Rest Link to Saint John With Early History of Colonizing Canada. When Saint John paid tribute to the loyal Empire Loyalists the old Loyalist burying ground came in for its share of attention. Laid out in 1784, a year after the Loyalists landed, this cemetery is in fact one of Saint John's business districts. An act of 1878 closed the ground to further burials. One of the notable graves is that of Christopher Brown who met Lord Howe, commander of the British forces. FISH ENDED MOSQUITOES French Scientist Tells of Malaria Success in One District. Use of Paris Green, and the stacking of stones and lath with a species of fish known as gambusia had done much to solve the malarial problem in France, according to Dr. Frederic Coussart of Paris, France, noted authority on malaria and mosquito control. Dr. Coussart, who came to Ontario to consult with William Hopkins Beck, United States Coastal General, stated that gambusia had been used with marked success in his home, France, which at one time was badly habitable owing to the mosquito pest.

HOSPITALS IN CANADA Canada is well supplied with hospitals. Records of hospital accommodation show that in 1931 there were 893 hospitals in Canada with a total bed capacity of 27,465 beds, which is at the rate of one bed to each 118 of the population. In proportion to population the most ample facilities are in British Columbia, where there are one hospital bed for 84 of the population. Of the 593 hospitals in Canada 454 are general public hospitals; the others are divided among a variety of classifications, including 31 Dominion Government hospitals, 41 Red Cross hospitals, 31 tuberculosis hospitals and one cancer hospital.

ROOSTER ATTACKED CHILD As a result of being attacked by a rooster the young son of E. Barnard, 644 of Agassiz, B.C., sustained painful facial injury. The boy wandered into the chicken yard on his father's property. When a hen with a number of chicks became excited on the boy's appearance, the rooster jumped at him, tearing the boy's face on either side of his nose with his spur.

LAWYERS IN PUBLIC LIFE Although there is only one lawyer in Canada for every 1,600 people, there is one lawyer in the House of Commons for every four members of other callings. The ratio in the Senate is slightly higher, and in the Provincial Legislatures it is about the same. These figures were worked out by Mr. Justice A. C. Ewing of the Supreme Court of Alberta.

ALIENISM IN CANADA The aluminum industry has a history of over 30 years in Canada. It began in 1903 with the establishment of the first plant at Shawinigan Falls for the reduction of the metal from its ore.
