

When Saint John paid tribute to the finted Empire Loyalists the old Loyalist turying ground came in for its share of ittenuon. Laid out in 1784, a year after in Loyalius landed, this centerry is in leart of Saint John's business district. ecords of hospital accommodation show that in 1931 there were 893 hospitals to Canada with a total brd capacity of 87, 465 beds, which is at the rate of one bad to each 118 of the population. La proportion to population the most ample facilities are to British Columbia, where there is one kospital hed for \$4 of the population. Of the 893 hospitals in Canada 458 are general public kespitals; the others are divided among a variety of classifications, including 33 Dominion Government hospitals, 43 Red Cross hospitals, 31 tuberrulosis hospitals and one cancer hospital
