PROVINCE CLAIMS EDITOR'S ESTATE

Hon. H. C. Nixon, Ontario's acting premier, revealed the province has laid claim to the estate of the late rictor of the Port Hope Chuide, who died early in November from arsenic poisioning.

Mr. Nixon said he would be guided

by the judgement of Attorney-General, Arthur Rocbuck in his attitude toward any move that might be made to have the government drop its claim to the estate which includes the news-

Legally, it is said the catate could be escheated by the crown because Wilson died leaving the estate to his widow who committed suicide a short time later after willing it to her daughter. She carried the daughter into Lake Ontario, drowning herself A coroner's jury decided the baby died first so that legally Mrs. Wilson died without heirs.
