Employed on railway construction to be sure, Thomas D. Gillivray, 32, of Edmonton, claims the distinction of having placed the last railroad spike on the C.P.R. when that transcontinental line was completed in the Pacific West in 1917. Gillivray has advised that he still has a clear recollection of incident on construction.

Mrs. Mary McNell, spokeswoman for the Red Cross, has over thirty years on the lower lakes as stewardess on the C.P.R. Great Lakes boats. She has also served for entire years as chief stewardess of S.S. Inverloch, sailing the lower lakes since 1915 until the close of the 1924 season.

COOKING HINTS WORTH KNOWING

Here's an idea that comes directly from one of the most famous kitchens in New York.
To give a new and different keenness of flavor to your meats whenever you baste them, use ice water and Hawaiian pineapple juice. Be sure to use the natural unweetened juice which is available in various sized containers—not the syrup in which ripe pineapples are packed.
The pineapple juice has the ability to intensify the flavors of meat, to bring out their meaty richness. Try it next time. You'll find that there is a distinct improvement and added relish to the flavor.
In the Hawaiian Islands many housewives and chefs are adding 1-3 pineapple juice to 3-5 water for cooking all vegetables. There is no date of pineapple juice in the cooked vegetable, but there is an added tenderness, an added zest that often makes the dinner.
Stuffing for Duck, Goose or Pork
4 large apples
2 cups stale bread crumbs
1 teaspoon powdered sage
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
Grated rind of half a lemon
1 cup Hawaiian pineapple juice
Dice and chop finely the apples. Blend with the bread crumbs and seasonings, moisten with the pineapple juice and use to fill the cavity from a shoulder of pork, or to stuff a bird for roasting. This stuffing is sufficient for 1 bird. Divide in half for small pork roast.
Chocolate Marshmallow Surprise
1 pkg. powder for making chocolate junkies
1 pint milk
1 cup confectioner's sugar
1/2 pound marshmallows
1 cup boiling water
