A Paddy Cake for Paddy's Day

By Betty Barclay To children of the "old sod" St. Patrick's Day is the most important holiday of the year. Even those who are not from Erin acknowledge the day as a day for parties, games and attractive decorations, games and menus can be arranged.

- 1 cup sugar 1 egg yolk (well beaten) 1 cup all-bran (rolled) 1/2 cup flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon cloves 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg 1/2 cup sour cream (thick) Add sugar gradually to egg yolk. Add all-bran, sift dry ingredients, and alternate with sour cream. Beat well. Pour into greased tin. Bake about 45 minutes in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.). Yield: 12 servings (1 cake 8 by 8 inches).
