**CHRIST THE SAVIOUR**  
International Uniform Sunday School Lesson, April 14, 1935

**GOLDEN TEXT:** "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3: 16.

**LESSON PARAGRAPHS:** John 3: 14-17; Romans 5: 6-10; Philippians 2: 5-11.

Give us a virtue Christ for these rough days!

You painters, sculptors, show the warrior bold; And you who turn mere words to gleaming gold; Too long your lips have sounded in the praise of patience and humility. Our ways have parted from the quietude of old.

We need a man of strength with us to hold The very breath of Death without amiss; Did he not scourge from temple courts the thrives? And make the arch-herod's will again to fall?

And blast the fig-tree that was only leaves? And still the raging tumult of the seas? Did he not bear the greatest pain of all, silent upon the cross on Calvary?

Heavenly Father, thou who hastenest the spiritual sunrise, hastenest our souls through living water to the light of Christ. Spiritual life is not for those who are content with their outward lives, but that we live through fellowship with Christ. The purpose of the church is to bring to the eyes of men a Christ who says out himself out in front of his Master. A preacher who understands the inner purpose of his work will still the behaviour and not give prominence to himself. Christ can save us only as we know him and obey him. Christ is not more than giving formal assent to a creed. To believe in Christ means to take his way of life and act upon it all the time.

The Little Gospel, 14, 17

What great words stand out in "the little gospel." These two verses contain the very heart of the New Testament, present such words as love, belief, life, salvation. The teaching of modern psychology is that we have spiritual health when we stress the positive. Christ came not to condemn people but to save them. How may we know that we are saved? There is one very simple but effective test—we are saved when we have faith in which we asked Christ to save us? Another test is to think of salvation as wholeness of health. Are we spiritually healthy? If our life is filled with fear, worry, and doubt, then we have not the salvation that Christ gives to man. An evangelist was in the habit of quoting vehemently, "The blood of Jesus Christ cleanses from all sins." One day he asked himself if Christ had cleansed him from all sin, and when he faced the facts of his own life, Christ really began to leave him from all sin. Salvation is not a tangible thing like a man taking out naturalization papers as a Canadian citizen. Salvation is a change of inner nature whereby the spirit of God dwells in.

The Love of God, 6-10

Sacrificial action calls forth human admiration. A policeman jumped into a moving motor car in which were two little children, and was able to get it stopped on a downhill career before an accident occurred. It is a test of friendship when one is willing to risk life for the sake of a friend. Christ's sacrifice, however, was not merely for his friends; it was for strangers also, and even for his enemies. He did it to rescue man to God. Salvation is not a human achievement—the initiative is taken by God who has fathered love towards mankind. A cynical newspaperman attended a religious gathering and tried to get at the motives of the workers. He could not understand people spending time and money to work voluntarily without any hope of financial reward. He ran down all the close of greed and grat and finally asked a leader, "What do you do this?" The answer came in three words, "For Christ's sake." The interviewer could not understand, but the leader had caught the spirit of Christ's sacrificial life and death.

Servant of God, 8-9

Paul was wonderfully helpful about people. He thought that men and women with whom he worked, could grow until they might have Christ's life within them. This growth comes through surrender. Christ made an utter and unreserved surrender of his life to God. His coming to earth is described as a self-emptying of position and power. In the Garden of Gethsemane he yielded his life to the will of God and accepted death upon the cross. Christ has made this saving power because He did not put self before the will of God. And we, too, are saved by Him when we surrender in His spirit to the will of God, and are willing to take up our cross daily and follow our Master. Saving power may be mediated through us according to Christ and surrendered our will fully to the will of God. Our wills are ours, we know not how, but we do know that we may make our will obedient to God's will. When we do this repeatedly and constantly, we have that mind in us which was also in Christ Jesus.

**The SNAPSHOT GUILD**

**SPRING LIGHTNING**



Lightning and moonlight pictures are unusual and fascinating and you can take them with any kind of camera.

**APRIL** showers not only bring May flowers but night-time electrical storms as well. And there's your chance for sensational lightning pictures.

With the dark, clouded skies the sharp ribbons of lightning spread in fantastic, fascinating flashes and when caught by the camera, the resulting picture is really something to talk about and adds variety and interest to your snapshot album.

There is no trick involved in taking lightning pictures. In fact, it's quite simple. If it is raining during the time the lightning is weaving its webs of flashes across the sky, and you don't want to get wet, take your picture from the inside through an open window. Place the camera on a tripod or something solid at the open window and point it in the direction of the last few flashes. Set your shutter at "time", using the largest diaphragm opening or "stop". You may close the shutter after the flash or leave it open for the registering of several flashes. Of course, if you leave the shutter open for many flashes, you will get a fantastic composition of ribbons of light but not a true picture of a single flash. However, it will be unusual, to say the least, and well worth adding to your collection of "frisks".

If it is an honest-to-goodness storm, it will pay you in self-satisfaction to take several pictures, for the more brilliant the flashes and the more ribbons of light alighting through the dark skies, the greater the chances for a really spectacular picture.

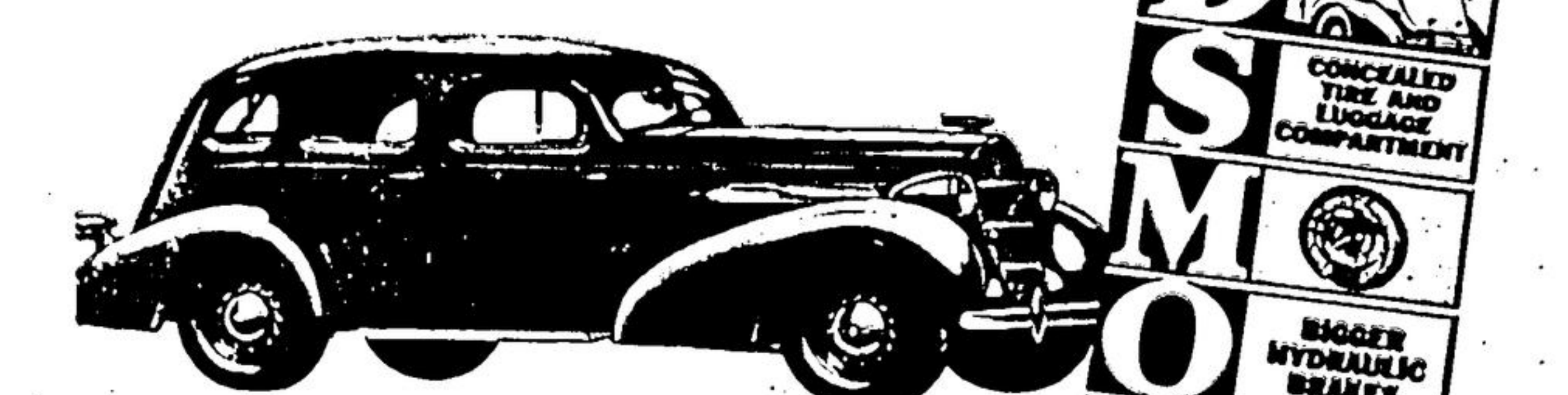

**RIDE AND HIKE in ROCKIES**

New territory in the Canadian Rockies will be opened this year by the Sky-Line Trail Hike and Trail Riders of the Canadian Pacific Railway. The members come from all over the world to enjoy these splendid recreations. On foot and on horseback, they set out from the Canadian Pacific Hotel to conquer the mountains—Not just to climb them, but to capture their beauty with cameras, to erect friendly, cheerful camps on their heights, and to carry away from their wooded slopes health and pleasant recollections. The official Sky-Line Trail Hike, from the second of August to the fifth, will follow part of the trail taken through the Rockies in 1934 by Sir George Simpson, governor of the Hudson's Bay Company.

It is planned to motor from Banff Springs Hotel to the wardens' cabin on Healy Creek on August 2, hiking to the Canadian Pacific cabin, the Bushkin Camp, the first day. In the second day Simpson Pass will be crossed and the second camp made at one of the Egypt Lakes near Mummy and Scarab Lake. The third night will be spent at Shadow Lake and the final Pow-Wow will be at Castle Mountain Camp on the Banff-Windermere Road, after which buses will be available for those who wish to go to Banff. The whole distance will be about 38 miles.

The official five-day trip of the Trail Riders is from July 26 to 30 and this year takes in the Red Deer River, former famous hunting ground but now included in the Banff National Park, which limits all hunting to cameras. The trout fishing is excellent and ample time will be set aside for fishermen, while the others in the party will take pleasant side trips. The party will motor about 11 miles from Banff to the crossing of the Cascade where horses will be waiting. The first camp, used for two nights, will be somewhere near Windy Camp. They then ride over Snow Creek Pass to Scotch Cabin on the Red Deer and turn west to the second camp. The trail will follow the Red Deer to its source, and turn south to Baker Lake and Ptarmigan Lake to a camp in the Ptarmigan Valley. The fifth day's ride is to the Sun Dance Lodge near Lake Louise Station, for the Pow-Wow.
