AGRICULTURAL ATTRACTIONS The directors of the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies, at meeting a few days ago, discussed at length attractions for fall fairs.

It was agreed judging should be arranged to afford educational opportunities and be as attractive as possible. Suitable flags should be provided for all live stock and the names of winners should appear in half exhibits.

Inter-community competitions were recommended, such as special prizes for Women's Institute displays. Junior classes have been found to arouse much interest and this year agricultural societies are sponsoring over 100 clubs for boys and girls.

In addition to the usual attractions, the following were suggested, having been tried by Societies and requiring little cash outlay: Antique displays. Open demonstrations. Hitching, driving and riding competitions. Milk maid contests. Horse drawing competitions. Classes for jumping horses. Teams of horses versus six or eight men. Horseback wrestling. Thrift binding competitions. Log sawing. Potato chopping. Musical chairs—mounted. Band competitions; old time fiddlers' contests, etc. Demonstrations of various kinds.
