An historic flag which withstood the rigours of the Arctic since it was car-

rigours of the Arctic since it was carried into the frozen north by Captain McClintock. afterwards Sir Francis McClintock. in 1857, when in search of the lost Sir John Franklin expedition, until recovered by a Canadian expedition. in 1906, has been lodged with the St. George's Society of Halifax, N.H., for safe-keeping. The flag was presented to the society by W. H. Weeks, who was purser on the Canadian expedition. The flag, however, is tattered and shows discoloration from its long stay in the Arctic.
