#### THE COLLECTION PLATE

Time was, within our recollection, when there was no collection plate in the church we attended, only plates on piliars in the main siales entering the church, and those entering might place what they pleased on the plates. In those days the givings were mostly coppers, or pennies and the aliver coins were small, few and far between. This method is still used in at least some churches in Scotland. When we attended a church there elsven years ago the plates were placed on a table in the vestibule, with an elder or two in attendance. In Canada, at least, this method has been superseded by the passing of a receptacle to the worshippers in the pews. In some cases this was a sort of bag hanging from a ring or hoop at the end of a handle several feet long, in others a box or wooden feet long, in others a box or wooden cup at the end of a handle. The handle made unnecessary the passing of the receptacle from one worshipper to another. Large shallow plates gradually came into use, these being passed from pew to pew by attendants and from worshipper to worshipper in
