Have you ever tried taking a picture of your wife wearing her new broad-brimmed summer hat and find, when you see the finished print, that her pretty face turned out to be an unattractive dark shadow? Of course you have. Who hasn't?

Now there is a really no excuse for this common error in amateur photography. You can't prevent the appearance of the shadow but you can lighten it considerably in the picture by using a reflector to cast or reflect the necessary light under the brim of the hat and on her face.

Please don't gasp and think about spending a lot of money for a reflector for it isn't necessary. A satisfactory, efficient reflector can be had for practically nothing.
