### OBITUARY

**JAMES J. COONEY, D.C.M.**

The late Dr. James J. Cooney, who passed away at his home on Church St. Arton on Sunday. Although in poor health for the past few months, he was still in the full possession of his faculties.

He had been a member of the Board of Trade and president of the Headstone plant the previous night and was about town on Sunday. He expired while resting at his home.

He was a resident of Acton for the past twenty-five years or more. Of a kindly and friendly nature, he was liked by everyone who knew him.

He was survived by his widow, who before marriage was Miss Marie Kennedy, and his two sons, Charles and Jack, have the sympathy of all. During the war he served overseas with the 14th Battalion and served overseas with the Princess Patricia Canadian Light Infantry. At Cambrai he won the Distinguished Conduct Medal for his gallantry in rescuing wounded from the battlefield. Jim was like that man who did not fail to help a fellow who needed assistance. He turned to action after the war, for some time, not comatose, and for several years has been a faithful and efficient employee of the Headstone Leather Co. He was a citizen who took part, no matter how small, in the community events. He was in his eightieth year, having been born at Brampton in 1858. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus, the Canadian Legion and a member of St. Joseph's Church. Action One brother, Isaac, of Toronto, survived him, and was present at the service. Jim was present at the funeral.

**WILLIAM J. COONEY**  
The retirement of Col. J. L. Ralston, the financial critic of the Liberals, leaves them without a first class man to win over to their side in the election that is due on October 14th. Of course it has not been unusual to go to politics for a Minister of Finance.

Col. Ralston, a former Dundas farmer and now successful financier will not, it is said, contest a seat in the coming election; and yet it is quite possible that he will be invited to return to the post he held briefly after the death of Hon. James Ross in November, 1898.

The victory of William Aberhart and his Social Credit party is likely to have an important effect on federal election activities.

It will give encouragement to Hon. H. Stevens, of Galt, who is also a candidate in one of the ridings in the country at least the voter is disposed to give new forces a trial.
