What is probably the world's farthest north golf links is located at Chesterfield Inlet on the northern shore of Hudson Bay in latitude 61° 45' N. It is called the most exclusive of all golf clubs as it has a membership of only four—the Church of England missionary, the Roman Catholic missionary, the Hudson's Bay Company's factor and his assistant.
