WATERWORKS

When other towns are going further in debt the debtors are gradually decreasing its obligations and are better shape today than any other town in the county. With careful management it will not many years until Georgetown is free of debt. It thanked those who had nominated the debtors and in closing said: "I have served honestly the ratepayers as a whole, have given much time and thought to the affairs, and if my record commends itself to you I will appreciate your support in the future. I will no longer require I will bear no ill-will to anyone. I thank the ratepayers for their support in the past and if it is not my pleasure to address you again, kindly accept my best and kindest wishes for your future happiness and the town's success."

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Reeve Harold Cleave said he appreciated the support of the electors last year whereby he was enabled to return to County Council and had the honor of being elected Warden of the County. He explained the work of County Council and how the ratepayers money was expended in the interest of roads and the various institutions of the county. The finances of the county were much improved and the debtors were being gradually reduced, \$300,000 having been paid off in the last five years. It took \$100,000 this year to carry on the affairs of the county. The road work program of the county brought about \$200 to Georgetown and the town council had worked together for the best interests of the town and had made substantial gains. He said the better and the tax rate could be reduced next year. He had been honored by the Warden, the members of the office in the county, and was now a candidate for Mayor. He would appreciate the interest of the ratepayers and if elected would lower the tax rate and give his best services to the town.
