

And it is true that both birds and animals soon learn the havens of asfety. There are numerous ways to attract

birds in winter. One of the simplest spiny leaves are not inviting to cate and the evergreen foliage is a good ahelier from storm. Another simple mothod is to place a long perch scross a living-room window a few inches below the top. This will be safe from cats and in plain view so that the bird monocuvers may be enjoyed by the family. By lowering the window from the top the sust can easily be renewed without going out into the anow. Suspend pieces as large as the fist just above the perch; and be sure that it is real sust instead of the half grutle sometimes offered as such. The birds will some that birds will soon find it, and the news spreads in birdland like gossip in a country town. In our own experience there is scarcely a moment during the day when there is not a tap-tap annoncing the presence of some bird nibbling the sust.

There is no substitute for insect life better than sust, though many other things may be added for variety. flome prefer to mait the fat, stirring in miliet, hamp, dried ground meat acraps, bread crumbs, sunflower acceds, nut meats, and wild berries of many sorts. None of these are more acceptable than elderberties, though shad dogwood, mountain ash, wild cherry, bittersweet, black alder, and many others are greedily devoured.
