**\$50,000 DAMAGE TO BURLINGTON BEACH PIER**

Damage of \$50,000 was caused to the lake pier at Burlington Beach during the week end storm, it was estimated after a survey of the broken structure that had been pounded for hours by mountainous waves. The piling was ripped away and buckled and great holes torn in the paved surface. When the base collapsed under the weight of heavy water and sand-fill gave way and a wide section disappeared under the waves. There were broken areas in the concrete for the entire length of the pier. The bay side was sheltered and there was no damage there. The pier was built last fall at a cost of \$200,000 after several months' work. A storm broke during the construction and the pier head had to be rebuilt.

The first game was between the Chicago Black Hawks and the Montreal Maroons.
