**VEYENZA LASLO**

She was a member of her son's Holy Cross church in Toronto. Surviving are one son, Emanuele Lorusso of Georgetown, 12 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. The funeral was held on Saturday, April 2nd, from the home of her son to Holy Cross church for High Mass at 10 o'clock, conducted by Rev. Father McBride. The pallbearers were: five grandsons, Frank and Rocco Lorusso, Georgetown; Frank and Mike Lorusso, Toronto; Aubrey McCorkay, Oshawa, and Wm. Chaplin, Georgetown. The remains were interred in Greenwood cemetery, Georgetown. There were beautiful floral tributes from relatives and friends.

**ROY G. FOSTER**  
Death came suddenly to Roy Foster, of 74 Delaware Avenue, Toronto, on Wednesday, Mar. 23rd. He was taken ill on Thursday, Mar. 17th with scarlet fever and pneumonia, and was taken to the General Hospital, afterwards to the Isolation Hospital, where he died.
