CANADIAN HORSES IN GREAT BRITAIN
Canadian horses imported into the United Kingdom in 1937 numbered 287 head as compared with 279 in 1936. Of the 1937 exports, 40 were hunters, selected and bought in Canada. The others were work horses, some of which were taken over to the United Kingdom by Canadian dealers. One lot was chosen by a British buyer who came over to Canada and made his own selections. In all cases the selection of the horses was particularly good, mostly heavy horses around 16 to 17 hands, sound and well-broken, and from four to five years of age.
