"Bill" Collier Winner Over Empire Games Runner

In West Toronto Business Men's Road Race Last Saturday Afternoon—His Time was 25.50 for the Five-Mile Stretch

Johnny Emmerson Eleventh in Field of Twenty-Three

Georgetown runners have a habit of turning out at the right time to defeat some of Ontario's outstanding track stars, also to cross up the critics—and Milton Wallace of the MoHarch Club, Toronto, brilliant Ontario runner, seems to be the one to take it on the chin. Last season Dave Crichton lead Wallace to the tape in more than one race, and again on Saturday, "Bill" Collier, another distinguished local runner, administered a sound trouncing.

The first of the spring road races held in Toronto last Saturday afternoon were sponsored by the West End Business Men and directed by the Elm Grove Athletic Club. Although the routes taken by the runners, were for the most part covered by snow, which had fallen during the night, the weather overhead was fairly good for running.

In all four races that took place, the runners ran true to form with the favorites taking the lead, except in the five-mile open event in which Collier of Georgetown severely defeated Mill Wallace and other runners from Ontario and Buffalo. Wallace had just recently returned from the British Empire Games in Australia, and was almost a sure bet to win this event. Collier was running under the colors of the Toronto Gladstone Club, and his fine showing proved the biggest upset of the day, and placed him in a class along with some of the outstanding five-milers.

Mico Valeriole, Guelph track star, was favored to be among the first three, but he also was forced to take fourth place over J. Utzig of Buffalo, a new runner. R. Martin of Allandale was fifth, and Neil Farrell of Guelph sixth. Collier's time for the five mile stretch was 25 minutes and 50 seconds.

Johnny Emmerson, another Georgetown boy who is steadily climbing the ladder to success, and who was in the same race, finished eleventh. This will also be considered as making a good showing, when you consider that the entire field number twenty-three. While Johnny does not class himself as a five-miler, his performance in this class is one of merit.

Georgetown sport fans extend congratulations to both these boys, and hope to hear more of their racing in the future.
