**NEW MIDDLE ROAD**  
HAS COST \$3,500,000

Almost \$3,500,000 has been spent on the new middle road between Hamilton and Toronto, and additional money will be spent this year. At present, 22 miles have been completed, and there is 3.5 miles yet to be completed on the new double-lane route. Up to the end of 1937, \$3,433,594 had been expended. The cost of the Cooksville "clover-leaf" had been \$43,909. Land expropriated in the area had included several homes, orchards and business properties, and had cost the government in the neighborhood of \$80,000 to re-imburse all claims. The amount expended in the Maple avenue district was not disclosed.
