Drunken Driver Penalties Motor vehicles will be impounded for three months automatically under first convictions of drunk driving, laid under the Criminal Code, or of driving after a permit is suspended or revoked, under amendments to the Highway Traffic Act. The amendments also viewed in sterner light the offense of failing to return to the scene of an accident and ruled that in event of a second conviction the motor vehicle shall be impounded. Previously the impounding penalty applied only to the third offense.
