OBITUARY
ROBERT JOHN WALDIE
Robert John Waldie, beloved husband of Mary Louheed, passed away at St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, on Friday, May 20th, in his 62nd year. Deceased was son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Waldie and was born on the farm lot 24, con. 1, Esquimaux township. He farmed for some years at Acton and worked as a carpenter for many years in Georgetown. He was married on August 5th, 1914, to Mary Louheed of County Tyrone, Ireland. He is survived by his widow and one daughter, Hazel; two sisters, Mrs. H. Sayers, and Mrs. Wm. Robertson, Acton. Four brothers, Alexander and William in Nesbitt, Manitoba, and Duncan and Donald of Acton. The funeral was held on Monday, May 23rd, with a brief service at the home, lot 21, second line, Esquimaux, at 2:00 o'clock, followed by service in Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton, at 2:30 p.m. The service was conducted by Rev. H. Bennie of Acton and D. D. Davidson of Georgetown. The remains were interred in Fairview Cemetery, Acton.

ALEX. G. PARRY
The passing of Mr. Alex. G. Parry, in Guelph General Hospital, on May 9th, was a distinct shock to his many friends in this community. The late Mr. Parry was born in Philadelphia, Penn., being the son of Mr. John Parry, a native of Anglesey, Wales. His mother was Miss Ellen Gray, a member of the well known Gray family who settled in this section. The father and son worked for some years in the Barber factory in Streetsville but later settled on lot 27, concession 6, west of Hillsburgh. On his father retiring to Hillsburgh, Alex. worked the old farm until 1899, when he, too, retired, built a house in Hillsburgh and has made Hillsburgh his home ever since. He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Nodwell; one sister, Mrs. Eli Thompson (Mayme) Parkhill. Another sister, Mrs. Chas. Baldwin (Betty) died three years ago. Perhaps the interest that was closest to his heart was the Masonic Order. In his thirty-five years of membership he seldom missed a meeting unless it was impossible to attend. Rev. H. L. Merner of the United Church conducted the burial service assisted by Rev. J. A. Jolliffe, a former pastor, and Rev. W. G. Charlton of the Christian Church. MRS. JOHN T. SHANKS
The following from the Reporter of Rapid City, Man., refers to a native of Esquimaux and a former highly esteemed citizen of this community:
"In the death of Brandon General Hospital on Tuesday, April 26th, of Ida Florence, nee John T. Shanks, the Pettapiece community lost a highly esteemed citizen, and one who greatly endeared herself to those with whom she came in contact during her thirty-two years residence in the district.
Mrs. Shanks was born at Ashgrove, Halton County, Ontario, December 3, 1873. On June 20, 1906, at Ashgrove, she became the bride of John T. Shanks, of Pettapiece, and the following month took up residence at her western home.
Mrs. Shanks possessed a pleasing personality, of great help to others. She devoted much time and talent to church work, and was actively interested in all its departments. It was in December that she took ill with what proved to be cancer.
Left to mourn her loss, besides her husband, is one daughter, Marian Ruth, at home; also three brothers, Fred and Norman Wrigglesworth, at Ashgrove, and Gordon, at Ogden, Utah.
The funeral was held from Pettapiece church on Friday afternoon, following a brief service at the family residence, many paying tribute to deceased's memory. Rev. W. W. Harland officiated, and Mrs. H. Wolstenholme and G. R. Kite sang "Ivory Palaces." The pallbearers were: G. H. Henderson, Oak River; T. Douglas and Austin Brownridge, Brandon; R. R. Short, T. Wolstenholme and H. M. Spearin, Pettapiece. There were numerous floral tributes from the Sunset Circle, the W.A., choir, church stewards, trustees and session; Corinthian Lodge, and others. Burial was made in Pettapiece cemetery."
