## The SNAPSHOT GUILD

SOFTEN THOSE SHADOWS!



No harsh shadows on the faces in this picture! The paper makes an excellent reflector, allows subjects to face AWAY from the sun, not squint INTO it! Try it and see!

WHEN one advises, "Use a reflector to soften and lighten shadows," most snapshoters think, "Oh, that is too complicated — too much trouble."

As a matter of fact, any white or light-colored surface can serve as a reflector, to make shadows soft and full of detail. For instance, look at a man reading a newspaper. The newspaper catches light and reflects it into his face — it is a very good shadow illuminator.

A white spring or summer dress catches light and reflects it to the subject's face, and under her chin. A broad white hat brim catches light from the dress, and reflects it to the subject's forehead.

A white building (see diagram) can be used as a reflector to lighten the shadow side of the person you are picturing. A white picnic cloth, spread in the sun, reflects enough light to soften shadows in the faces of all the group around it.

Whenever you are taking pictures of people, especially in sunlight, make sure that the shadows are softened in some fashion. Black shadows under the subject's eyebrows and nose ruin a picture. Use any sort of reflecting surface — a white cardboard, white cloth, newspaper, the wall of a white house — anything handy that will reflect light. It takes only a moment to arrange subject or reflector properly — and the picture will be immensely improved.

### News and Information For the Busy Farmer

#### Livestock Bedding

Straw is the bedding material for livestock almost universally used on the farm in Canada. It will absorb two to three times its weight of liquid. Peat moss used as bedding will absorb about ten times its weight of liquid. Other suitable kinds of bedding for livestock are sawdust and air-dried muck and peat.

#### Farm Land Values

For the third year in succession, average values of occupied farm lands in Canada are estimated at \$24 per acre. Farm land values have been declining since 1928 when they were reported at \$38 per acre. A low point of \$23 per acre was reached in 1934 and an increase of \$24 occurred in 1935 since when the values have remained at that figure.

#### Soybean Experiment

After fourteen years of experimental work with soybeans at the Harrow Experimental Station in Kent county, Ontario, the list of suitable varieties recommended has been narrowed down to four. One of these, the Marston, is suited to Eastern Ontario, since it matures in 110 days and is a good type. The variety O. A. C. 211 requires an extra week to mature and is adapted to southwestern districts of Ontario. Marston, a medium late sort, requires about 120 days to mature and the A. K. (Harrow strain) takes 127 days. Both may be grown in favorable seasons and the A. K. Harrow is desirable on account of length of stalk and high yield.

Plantings of different varieties have been made at Harrow as early as April 23 and at weekly intervals until May 15. Under most conditions it has been found that the soil does not warm up sufficiently until the middle of May. A severe frost will ruin the young plants. Late maturing varieties there is need to plant in good time to obtain ripe seed so that for southwestern Ontario May 15 to May 20 may be recommended for planting.

#### Controlling Cutworms

Cutworms are usually active and feeding before most crops are even in the ground. Hence it is most important to be prepared for their attack at the beginning of the season. Bran bait has given most effective control for many years.

A list of the ingredients composing the bran bait includes bran, 20 pounds; molasses, one quart; Paris green, one-half lb.; and water (about) 2½ gallons. In making the bait the dry ingredients should be mixed thoroughly first. The molasses is then stirred into water and this solution added to the bran and Paris green. In mixing the bait, only enough water should be added to make the consistency of wet sawdust, so that it will crumble in the hands and slip through the fingers easily.

Land that was heavily infested last year should be treated before the plants are set out. This is done by broadcasting the bait at the rate of 15-20 pounds per acre a few nights before transplanting. One application should be sufficient, but if the cutworms are very numerous, a second application should be made two or three days after the first one. The bait should always be spread in the evening just before dusk, and if possible, a warm still night should be chosen for the work.

If the attack is unexpected and the plants are already in the field, the bait should be applied around the base of each plant, using about half a teaspoon per plant. Should one application of the bait not kill all the cutworms, a second treatment should be made two or three nights later.
