#### ABOUT MANION

**THE NEW LEADER OF NATIONAL CONSERVATIVE PARTY**

Hon. Dr. R. J. Manion is tall, broad-shouldered, with the build of an athlete, and has been best known through his twenty years of public life for his ready smile, his flashing Irish wit, and his occasional bursts of scathing sarcasm when goaded in debate.

A candidate for leadership of the Conservative party at the 1927 convention in Winnipeg, Manion ran 424 in the two ballots, getting 170 votes on the first, and 148 on the second.

Born in Pembroke, Ont., Nov. 18th, 1891, he moved with his parents to Fort William, Ont., where he gained his preliminary education, later attending Queen's University and University of Toronto, with post-graduate courses in medicine in Glasgow and Edinburgh.

The war called Manion to France Army Medical Corps, and later with the Canadians, winning the Military Cross at Vimy Ridge.

In the 1917 election, Manion was selected Liberal candidate for Fort William, although still in France. He had been an adherent of the Liberal Party up to that point, but he turned Unionist and contested the riding against Liberal opposition and won. He was returned as a Conservative for Fort William at every election following, until 1935, when he was defeated.

Just prior to the 1921 election Manion was Minister of the newly organized Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, but his party went out of power in the 1921 election. He was Postmaster-General in the short-lived Meighen Government of 1926.

When the Conservatives came back to office after the 1930 campaign, in which Manion was a tireless worker, he was chosen Minister of Railways.
