"Look Before You Pass" Is Warning to Drivers

"Sight Distance" Vital to Safe Driving, Explains R. H. Morley, Safety Association Head.

In a bulletin issued today to members of the Industrial Accident Prevention Association, General Manager R. H. Morley urges all automobile drivers to bear in mind that the matter of passing other cars on the highway is not a matter of "maybe yes and maybe no," but a matter of pre-determined mathematical fact.

"Safe sight distance," he points out, "depends on the speeds of the passing and overtaking vehicles and the speed of the vehicle approaching from the opposite direction. If the difference in speed between the passing vehicle and the one which is overtaken is great, the safe passing distance is less than when the difference is small. It also increases materially if more than one vehicle is to be passed."

A driver of a vehicle travelling 40 miles an hour, Morley explains, will require 1,200 feet of sight distance to pass another vehicle going 30 miles an hour, when the opposing traffic is coming toward him at his own speed of 40 miles. If he wants to pass, two cars, his sight distance must be 1,600 feet, and 2,000 feet to pass three cars in line. These sight distances are doubled when the passing car is travelling 60 miles an hour against opposing traffic of equal speed, and when the car or cars to be passed are travelling at 50 miles.

"These figures are based," comments Mr. Morley, "on the braking distance of the vehicles, the total speed of moving traffic, and the reasonable assumption that vehicles keep far enough back from the car ahead to stop in an emergency, and also that the passing car will not pull in line so close that the car passed would be unable to stop safely if necessary."

Ontario Peach Crop Ten Days Earlier Than Last Year

A peach crop survey conducted by the Ontario Department of Agriculture last week shows that canning peaches of the famous "V" type, Vidette, Vasant, Veteran, will reach Ontario Markets the week of August 15th. These varieties, originated at the Horticultural Experiment Station, Vineland, have largely replaced the Crawford in the affection of Ontario housewives. They will be followed by the Elberta two weeks later.

The entire crop will be ten days earlier than last year, growers agree. They point out that Rochester, a good canning peach, but not quite so free at the pit as the "V" peaches, was first picked last year August 19th and was ready by the 10th this year. In discussing crop prospects, growers stated that owing to increased production as a result of more trees coming into bearing for the first time this year, "V" peaches will show an increase of 15 per cent over 1937. Elbertas are down 10 to 15 per cent which will make the canning crop just about equal to the total for 1937 with quality better than last year. Prices will be just as reasonable, growers predict.

This means that housewives will be able to have all their peaches canned before the Canadian National Exhibition opens August 26th. It also means fresh luscious peaches for Toronto tables every day of the exhibition, a hot weather breakfast, luncheon and dinner offering that everyone enjoys.

KING EXPECTED TO VISIT CANADA IN 1939

London papers say the King and Queen will visit Canada and the United States during 1939, although no plans have yet been discussed and no invitations issued. It was understood that Lord Tweedsmuir, Governor-General of Canada, mentioned unofficially the possibility of a visit though an invitation from Canada would come through the Prime Minister. Mackenzie King recently stated that the King needed no invitation to visit the Dominion since Canada always stood ready to welcome its sovereign.

GUELPH FAIR ADDITION STILL IN DOUBT

Unless some definite action is forthcoming immediately from either the Provincial Government or the County of Wellington, the proposed new addition to the Provincial Winter Fair building at Guelph will not be erected this year. With only \$30,000 on hand, the fund lacking \$10,000, originally plans were laid for a \$30,000 building, but this was for a two-story structure with wooden beams, and the Provincial Government refused to grant permission for such construction, demanding steel beams be used. This raised the figure from \$30,000 to approximately \$40,000.

DANNY DODGE MEETS DEATH NEAR MANITOULIN

A stick of dynamite blasted tragedy into the lives of five persons near Little Current, Manitoulin Island, on Monday, when Danny Dodge, 21-year-old heir to the automobile millions, and a bridegroom of only two weeks, drowned in Georgian Bay as he was being rushed by motor boat to hospital following an accidental explosion.

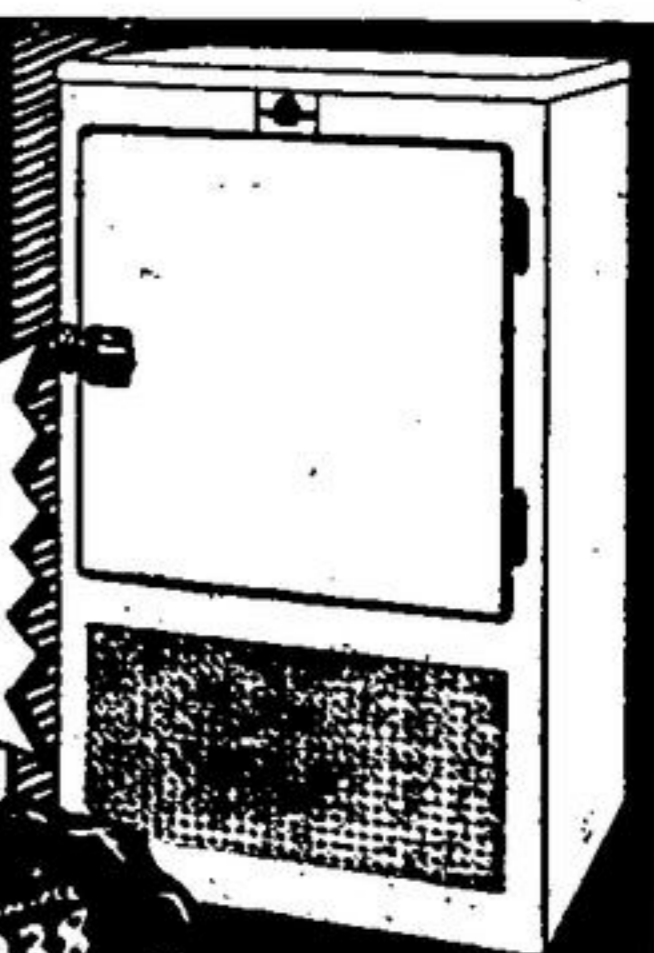
