**The SNAPSHOT GUILD**

**GET AN IDEA FIRST**

**BEFORE you snap a picture, do you have in your mind a clear idea of what you want the picture to say?**

This is important because every picture needs a "central picture idea" to give it style and meaning. Especially when you are with persons in it, make some sort of action (or activity) to give it life.

By "action" I don't mean rapid motion, but merely that the person pictured should be doing something.

For example, suppose you have a small character and every now and then you want a new picture of her. Well, don't just get her to stand in a corner of the background and look at the camera while you snap. Relate her to her surroundings, her life, her character, her personality, her ideas; make her do something out of the ordinary, something that you can't get her to do in a regular picture.

It's a good picture method. Snap with a clear idea, and make the picture do it. When you picture people, make them do something. Make pictures "snap" something, and you know they will in fact and appeal.
