**Health Officer Presents**  
**Details in Regard to Sewer System**

FIRST LETTER IN SERIES WHICH WILL APPEAR

Early this summer the Town Council authorized the firm of Hagey, Gray and Plunkett, consulting engineers, to make a complete survey of the Municipality with estimated cost of a sewer system.

The survey has been completed and the plans have been approved by the Ontario Department of Health. A report was given to the Town Council recently.

On account of its involved character, it was requested that this firm should have a clear understanding of what the proposed sewer system would give them in the way of benefits and what the financial responsibility would also mean to them.

Letter number one, follows:—  
Taxpayers in Georgetown are entitled to have a clear understanding of what the proposed sewer system would give them in the way of benefits and what the financial responsibility would also mean to them.

The benefits should be divided into two classes: improved health conditions, due to better sanitation, and personal comfort.

It will be hard to deny in this enlightened age that the elimination of the outdoor privy with its accompanying countless germ bearing flies is a great step forward in sanitation. Even at their best, septic tanks are dangerous and in the course of time usually so saturate the adjoining earth that they are a constant source of possible pollution.

There are other facts in the health interests which are obvious to anyone.

The personal comforts associated with a sanitary sewer system include toilets, bath, laundry tubs and complete cellar drainage. Any housewife can picture without difficulty what a boon these would be.

On the debit side of this picture appears the financial obligation. This can be best made plain as follows:—  
A sanitary sewer system must have a disposal plant where all the sewage is concentrated and treated at a point remote from residences, and a trunk system to collect and carry the sewage to the disposal plant. These two items are a charge against the entire Corporation and their estimated cost is \$37,000.00.

The normal way in which an expenditure such as this is met is by the issuance by the Town of debentures, spread over a period of 30 years. These debentures could be sold by Georgetown bearing 4% interest. In order to retire this \$37,000.00 of debentures in 30 years the Town would have to raise each year \$2140.00, or in other words increase the general mill rate 1 - 7-10 mills. A simple way to explain what this would mean to an individual property owner is as follows:—

If you are a property owner and your property is assessed for \$1,000.00, then it would raise your taxes \$1.70 per year. If your assessment is \$2000.00 then your charge would be \$3.40 per year.

We have now explained the cost and method of financing the trunk sewers and the disposal plant. The next step in the sewer system is the construction of the lateral sewers. Lateral sewers are the sewers which are placed on each street, and which collect the sewage from all buildings and thence carry it to the trunk lines and disposal plant.

The cost of these laterals is paid for by charging the property owners in front of whose property they are constructed \$ .08 per foot per year for 30 years. This charge is sufficient to pay the entire cost, an example of what this would mean to an average property owner having a lot with a 66 foot frontage is 66 x 8 = \$5.28 per year for 30 years. If the same owner is assessed for a value of \$1000.00, his total annual charge would be \$3.96 plus \$1.70, or \$5.66.

If an owner is located on a corner lot where a sewer runs on both the front and side he is given a flankage or side allowance of usually 50% of the side measurement. This can be increased or lowered by the Council when the work is authorized.

In addition if a lateral sewer runs in front of property which is used for building purposes, but its construction is necessary in order to serve other property, then the Council are empowered under the Local Improvement Act to exempt the owner from payment. This also applies to land which is under cultivation, such as farm land.

From this explanation it should be plain to anyone that the cost to individual property owners is comparatively small, and the benefits should far outweigh this modest cost.
