He had always enjoyed good health and his sudden death was a shock to his family and the community. Deceased was 49 years of age and was born in Esquevas, a son of the late John W. Bessey. He was married 21 years ago to Emily Anthony and after farming in Erin for a few years he purchased the Georgetown flour and chopping mill 17 years ago and has been a resident of the town ever since. He was a member of Town Council for some years and always took an interest in the affairs of the town. He was a business man and a citizen he will be sadly missed in town and community, and his untimely death is deeply regretted. Besides his wife and daughter Doris, he is survived by his mother, three sisters and three brothers, Mrs. Morris, Toronto; Mrs. (Mrs.) E. MARSHAL TRILLER THOMPSON
Marshal Triller Thompson, Postmaster in Erin, died at the family residence, on Saturday, October 22nd, following a protracted illness. A son of the late Joseph Triller Thompson and Maria Gallagher, he was born on the Thompson homestead, 10th Line Esquevas Township, in 1862. He came to Erin in 1889 and conducted a farm on the Guelph Road, until he was appointed Postmaster in Erin, in 1917. He was a member of the United Church and was treasurer of the church for seven years. He was also a member of the bowling and curling clubs. In 1902 he united in marriage with Constance Louise Hunter, who with one son, Ralph Hunter, and one grand-daughter Ann Louise, of Toronto, survive him; he is also survived by one sister, Mrs. Emma J. Leslie, Erin; one brother, Fred C. Thompson, Georgetown; a brother, Bryon, predeceased him. The funeral took place from the family residence on Monday afternoon, when his pastor, Rev. G. H. Thomas conducted the obsequies and brought a comforting message to the bereaved family, neighbors and friends. The pallbearers were: Messrs. J. Leslie Thompson, Toronto; F.
