## TESTED RECIPE

NO hostess wants to see guests "picking at" a dessert which has taken her time and trouble to make. But the capacity of the most appreciative guest is limited — and after a lavish holiday dinner only the lightest of desserts can be done justice to. But it must be a dessert worthy of the occasion — and here's one which is.  
Jellied Apricots in Sherry  
1 package raspberry-flavored gelatin; 1 pint hot water, minus amount of sherry to be used; 1/4 lb 1/2 cup sherry; 8 canned apricot halves; 1 cup finely diced apples. Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Cool and add sherry. Arrange apricots on bottom of mold. Pour on gelatin being sure not to disarrange apricot halves. Chill until firm. Unmold. Serves 6.
