### Waffles and Friends for Sunday Night

TO my way of thinking, one of the most pleasant meals of the week is Sunday night supper in the company of one or two friends. And for that occasion, nothing beats waffles as the picnic de resistance. Start off with tomato juice, then serve Ham Waffles with soft scrambled eggs and finish up with coffee and cookies. That meal has "got something" as the young folks put it!

**Ham Waffles & la Marigold**  
(Sour milk waffles)  
2 cups sifted cake flour; 1 1/2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder; 1/4 teaspoon soda; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 1 tablespoon sugar; 2 egg yolks, well beaten; 1 1/4 cups sour milk or buttermilk; 4 tablespoons melted butter or other shortening; 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten; finely diced cooked ham.  
Sift flour, soda, salt, and sugar, and sift again. Combine egg yolks, milk, and butter; add to flour mixture, beating until smooth. Fold in egg whites. Bake in hot waffle iron, sprinkling each waffle with about 1/4 cup ham just before closing iron. Serve soft scrambled eggs on each waffle. Makes four or five 4-section waffles.
