GEORGETOWN SHOULD ASK THAT TRAIN BE STOPPED HERE

It is stated that when the King and Queen visit Canada next May and June, they will pass through Georgetown on their way home from Western Canada—making stops at Kitchener and Guelph. The Town Council should prevail upon the officials arranging this tour to have the royal train stop at Georgetown station on its route to Toronto.

HAPPY NEW YEAR. Many look to 1939 with some misgiving. The prospect of war in Europe is no less than it was twelve months ago. The possibility of great improvement in internal trade is not dazzling. All in all, pessimism is easy to cultivate.

In any event we can hardly see in 1939, a debacle such as was witnessed in 1929—unless we run into a war panic the like of which neither appeasement nor truculence can avert.

On the whole, our guess—which is neither better nor worse than any other person's guess—is that the coming twelve months will see business going forward slowly in a less stormy sea than in the last twelve months, but that rapid progress is not likely for the reason that taxes will continue to take too large a proportion of the national income.

It will be a fairly good year—as past years have been—for those who work hard, with intelligence again succeeding better than mere energy.

A forced air ventilating system and large hot water heaters ensure a comfortable and healthy atmosphere at all seasons.

Convenient overhead racks accommodate your parcels and hand luggage. Although they seat 37 passengers, the Cruisers are lighter than former coaches and are more flexible and more easy to handle in traffic. They are equipped throughout with safety glass and have specially designed air brakes and other features that create a new margin of safety for passengers.
