> Stevens' Engine First to Pull a Train on a Track

Three dates are important in the history of the steam locomotive. On October 23, 1824, the first steam locomotive that actually pulled a train on a track, that built by John Stevens, was run on a circular track on his estate at Hoboken, says a writer in the Philadelphia Inquirer.

The first locomotive for railroad use was the "Stourbridge Lion," which was built by the George Stephenson works upon the Tyne river in England. Horatio Allen was sent to England by the Delaware & Hudson Railroad dompany to buy it. The engine traveled at the speed of 10 miles an hour. Its first run in the United States was on August 9, 1829, on the tracks of the Delaware & Hudson between Carbondale and Honesdale, the canal terminus in

Pennsylvania. The "Tom Thumb," designed by Peter Cooper, was the first locomotive built in the United States to draw passengers. On August 28, 1830, it carried 26 passengers 13 miles over the tracks of the Baltimore & Ohio in 1 hour and 15 min-
