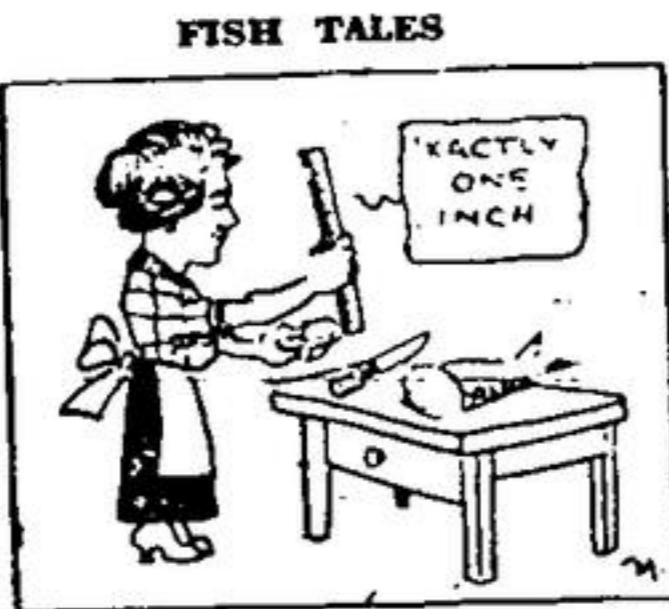

This Month's STAR RECIPE



Limas Angler
(Limas prepared by this Recipe are even more easily digested)
2 cups dried Limas
2 tablespoonfuls butter or bacon fat
Soak Limas over night; then carefully slip the hulls off them (which is easily done). Place in cooking pan with only sufficient water so that after thirty to forty minutes cooking, the beans will be tender. Cook preferably in heavy aluminum dish, kept tightly covered. This method will bring out the full nut-like flavor of the Limas.

Many of you have tried my monthly Star Recipes and found them entitled to the "Star." This month I have chosen an extremely simple recipe as my favorite—but with all its simplicity it surely is entitled to a place in the Hall of Recipe Fame.

All you need are a few dried Lima beans and some butter or bacon fat. Follow the directions carefully and you'll have a dish flavorful enough to place before your most particular guests—and healthy too. Needless to say it is economical and exceptionally easy to prepare.
