Dr. J. L. Simpson in an interview today. He referred to the influence the schoolroom was having on children in connection with the forthcoming Canadian tour of Their Majesties King George and Queen Elizabeth.

"The strengthening of the ties Empire is noticeable in the classrooms," said Dr. Simpson. broading of the school curriculum affords teachers the opportunity of combining classroom subjects with current events, and the interest of children in Canadian geography is heightened as they study the itinerary of the Royal tour. Increased interest in Canadian and British history is being developed as children realize the importance and significance of the Roval tour."

Many Ontario schools, he said, were making plans to take thousands of children to central points where they would be able to see Their Majesties and join in the celebrations.
