**FULL TITLE OF MAJESTY A  
 MOUTHFUL**

Persons who are looking forward to addressing King George and Queen Mary should practise deep breathing if they are desirous of addressing the majesties by their full and complete titles.

The complete, formal and official title of King George will take more than belated lungs if repeated without pause. It is as follows:—  
 His Most Excellent Majesty George the Sixth, Albert Frederick Arthur George of Windsor, by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Sovereign of the British Orders of Knighthood, Admiral of the Fleet, Field Marshal, Marshal of the Royal Air Force, Colonel-in-Chief of the Life Guards, Royal Horse Guards, 1st The Royal Dragoons, Royal Regiment of Artillery, Corps of Royal Engineers, the 5th Regiment of Foot Guards, The Royal Marines, The Royal Welsh Fusiliers, The King's Own Royal Rifle Corps, The Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders, The Royal Tank Corps, The Duke of Lancaster's Own Yeomanry (T.A.), The Officers' Training Corps, 16th Light Cavalry, 2nd Dragoon Regiment, The Black Watch, Royal Highlanders, The King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, Honorary Colonel 14th London Regiment London Scottish, T.A.

Then you may take a very deep breath and address Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth in the following very complete manner:—

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, Lady of the Garter, Lady of the Thistle, Dame Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, and of the Order of the British Empire, Doctor of Literature, Colonel-in-Chief The Queen's Bays, 2nd Dragoon Regiment, The Black Watch, Royal Highlanders, The King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, Honorary Colonel 14th London Regiment London Scottish, T.A.

King George the Sixth is the second son of His Late Majesty King George the Fifth and of her Majesty Queen Mary, born at York Cottage, Sandringham, December 14, 1895, and married on April 26, 1923, the lady Elizabeth Angela Marguerite, daughter of the 14th Earl of Strathmore and Kinghorne.

The majesties succeeded to the throne on Dec. 11, 1936, and were crowned at Westminster, May 12, 1937.  
 If you are to converse at any length with the King or Queen you should know they have two daughters: Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary of York, Princess of Edinburgh, born at York Cottage, Sandringham, December 14, 1926, and married on April 26, 1923, the lady Elizabeth Angela Marguerite, daughter of the 14th Earl of Strathmore and Kinghorne.

**STOP WANTON KILN  
 OF WILD FLOWERS**

Canada's diminishing succession of lovely wild flowers from Spring to Fall has now reached the point that their ultimate disappearance can be avoided only by the careful consideration of the people. Throughout the years, the greatest destruction of wild flowers has been the clearing of the forests and land for farms and habitations, assisted by forest fires and the grazing of animals. Still later, the wanton picking on the part of persons, particularly in the vicinity of the larger centres of population, has hastened the possibility of wild flowers sharing the fate of the buffalo, the musk ox, the great auk, the carrier pigeon and other wild life, for at least some of the finest specimens in the woods have disappeared. Hence, the appeal of horticultural societies throughout Canada for the preservation of wild flowers.  
 The preservation of wild flowers does not mean that no one is allowed to pick a bloom, but that demand a little thought from the picker. For example, some wild flowers should not be picked at all. Plants like the white trillium, the floral emblem of Ontario, are best left alone in all the glory of their original setting, because these flowers, when picked without removing all the foliage on which depends the maturing of the bulbous root for the following season's crop of flowers. Other species of wild flowers, such as violets, hepaticas and the like whose flower stems rise directly from the root, may be picked at will, provided the body of the plant is left undisturbed.  
 Tearing up a plant by the roots to gain a bloom is wanton destruction and means only one thing—the passing of beautiful flowers from the Canadian landscape. It is against this reckless plucking of wild flowers that the horticultural societies make their appeal.

**GOLD MAP FOR KING AND  
 QUEEN**

Canada's souvenir gift to the King and Queen in connection with their month's tour of the Dominion will be a handsome piece of gold plate bearing a map of Canada, which will have route and stopping places of their majesties' tour inscribed on it.  
 Prime Minister Mackenzie King has given personal attention to the matter, embracing both the important decision as to the nature of the gift and its execution.  
 The gift, as finally decided upon, will typify Canada as the Dominion's great gold production. It will be a masterpiece of the Canadian goldsmith's art. It will have special value as a souvenir of their majesties' trip from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and back again. And it will serve as a life-long memento.  
 Presentation will be made by Premier King, possibly at Ottawa on May 20, which is being celebrated as the King's Birthday, or, more probably, at Halifax just before their Majesties' fall for home on June 15.  
 Work on the gold plate is now being completed by a Montreal firm. While the cost is not known, it will run to several thousand dollars.
