THE ROYAL VISIT

Through the co-operation of the Town Council, Public School Board and the Canadian Legion, the children of the Public School will be taken to Guelph on June 6th to join with the Guelph school children in welcoming Their Majesties on their visit to that city.

Arrangements have been completed whereby a special train will leave the Canadian National depot at 11:45 daylight saving time, on June 6th, arriving at Guelph in time to have with children in their places for the event. A section along the track has been selected and assigned to Georgetown Public School. This section will be roped off so that none but Georgetown pupils can enter. The Canadian Legion will police and guard the area and will assist the school staff in protecting and caring for the children.

School children going on this train to Guelph will be under the care and supervision of their teachers the same as when they are in school. Parents will not be permitted to ride in the cars assigned to the children. Parents who want their children to go on this trip will be required to fill in and sign the form taken home by the children. Each child who brings the form properly filled and signed to his or her teacher will be given an identification tag which will entitle him or her to a free railroad ticket. Pupils who do not bring the permission form to their teachers will not be taken under supervision of the school staff, but will have to purchase their own tickets and travel as individuals. Passage on this special train will be available to all others who wish to make the trip, but they will not be permitted in the section of the train reserved for the Public School children.

All Public School children going on this trip are requested to meet at the Canadian National station at 11:15 on the morning of June 6th, and will form up according to classes the same as if they were on the school grounds. The Principal and staff will be in complete charge of the children from the time they leave Georgetown until they return. The train will leave Guelph at 3:30 p.m. daylight saving time to return to Georgetown.

While the School Staff and the Canadian Legion will take the best possible care of these children it is distinctly understood that neither the Town Council, Public School Board nor the School Staff is to be in any way held responsible for any accidents.

SEWAGE SYSTEM DISCUSSED BY DR. C. V. WILLIAMS M.O.B.

present situation is most unsatisfactory. It is difficult to definitely fix cases of sickness as having originated from these unsanitary conditions. It has, however, been noted that we meet a large number of cases of summer diarrhoea in late August and September. It is probable that most of this sickness results from the carrying of infection by flies. The flies breed and carry germs of diarrhoea from decaying organic matter, chiefly from inefficient cesspools, septic tanks and privies. This disease is usually fairly mild in adults but causes loss of time, discomfort, and expense. In infants, however, it is severe and one of the chief causes of death. Typhoid Fever can also be spread in this manner. So those who feel that their individual systems of sewage disposal are adequate, are not immune to disease which originates on the premises of their neighbours.

Recreational facilities will be improved by the elimination of factory and human waste which is polluting our streams. These streams are malodorous and unsafe for swimming. The area known as "the flats" could be developed into a beauty spot with play grounds, etc. if a sewer system were installed. At the present time the place is an eyesore and a disgrace to the town.

It is known that for many years some householders have secretly connected their cesspools, etc. to town storm sewers. The odour of such material in traps on some streets is at times overpowering and a source of complaint. From there it passes directly into the river. For some years the practice has been permitted to continue. It was felt that sewer installation would soon be undertaken and that these people were driven to these measures when all other methods had failed. Should sewer installation be further deferred, these "hook-ups" will be cut off when found. Furthermore, those homes whose waste disposal is unsatisfactory and where there is no means of correcting it, will be declared unfit for habitation and closed. This will create a great hardship for some. The only alternative is sewer installation.

With sewers all bathroom and laundry waste, water from eave troughs, flooding cellars are adequately cared for. The property owner will pay each year for 20 years a small sum which will aggregate less over that period of time than is now being spent for temporary methods. Further, the town will be a healthier, more prosperous, and a more pleasant place for all.

In my next and last letter a description of the proposed system and its financing will be described.
