### TIME TO ERADICATE THIS YEAR, CAMPTON

Canada Thistle and Bladder Campion Two Perennial Weeds Proving Bane To Grain Fields and Pastures this Year, States Weed Expert

Canada thistle, one of the best known weeds on Ontario farms and roadsides, is very prevalent this year, states John D. McLeod of the Crops, Seeds and Weeds Branch, Ont. Dept. of Agriculture, and should be spotted at once in grain fields. Infested pastures should be mown. Thorough cultivation and a short rotation of crops which include clover and a hoe crop will also prove effective. Immediately a crop has been harvested or a field pastured closely, plow deeply and cultivate at regular intervals during the heat of the summer, using a stiff-toothed cultivator with wide shares which overlap. Underground stems are thus brought to the surface and the sun does a good job of killing. Bladder Campion differs from Canada Thistle in that this free-branched weed has a tap root that deeply penetrates the soil. Individual plants may be dug out, but heavy infestations may be checked by using the Stephen weed killer. Information as to this weed killer may be obtained by writing the Crops, Seeds and Weeds Branch, Ont. Dept. Agriculture, Toronto, or from your Agricultural Representative.

## Canadian National

### BURLINGTON VOTERS IN FAVOR OF HAMILTON MILK

Balloting on a special plebiscite submitted on Monday, Burlington electors declared in favor of allowing Hamilton dairies to sell milk here. The vote was 515 to 336, a margin of 179 for those opposing the restrictive regulation which has barred outside distributors from Burlington market for many weeks.

The total of 851 ballots cast represented about half the voting strength. Those in favor of outside competition, had a majority in all of the four wards, the closest division being in Ward 2, where there was only a one-vote lead.

Following question was submitted: "Are you in favor of all Hamilton dairies being permitted to sell milk in Burlington, without local inspection of same?"

The existing by-law will be amended at the next meeting of the Council. The plebiscite was submitted to the people after a series of stormy council sessions and protests from residents who objected to the order which prohibited outside dairies from distributing in the town.
