COUNTY RIVALS PLAY WIDE-OPEN TIE GAME

In the second senior rugby game between Milton and Georgetown High Schools the play was fast although hampered by a smaller field. Milton started the game by kicking to Georgetown. Georgetown moved steadily up the field until they were forced to kick. Milton fumbled and McMenemy recovered and scored for the Scarlet and Blue. The attempt to convert this touchdown was not completed and Georgetown was ahead 3 to 0.

It was a high-scoring game and Milton went ahead in the second quarter, when two long forwards in succession put them on Georgetown's 1 yard line. Snyder went over on the second down and the touch was converted. Sproat hooped a single for the Blue and White and added another converted touch on a long run rouge run-back. Bob Early intercepted a lateral on a Milton end run and went over standing up for Georgetown's second touchdown, leaving it still anybody's game.

In the second half the Scarlet and Blue line held well but the defense was caught flat-footed by Milton forward passing attack. Two long passes from Sproat to Scott and a convert made it 19 - 11 for Milton. But from there on the game was stopped completely. The try for the convert was incomplete and the kick-off Coffel was tackled with hardly any gain and when Georgetown failed to make yardage Lorrman got away a long kick, was received by Sproat and run back to Georgetown's forty. Milton's attempt for a touchdown was stopped and Georgetown again had the ball.

In the third quarter Early scored Georgetown's fourth touchdown after three singles by McMenemy and Lorrman to bring the score to 24 - 23. The convert was completed on a pass from McMenemy to Allingham and the game was tied. It remained this way till the finishing whistle, although Milton would have scored except for the fact that the Scarlet and Blue made a gallant last minute stand holding the Milton team almost on the goal line.

those who teach the young is not a happy one in all cases. Claim is made that 32% of Canadian teachers earn less than \$50 per month, and about 52% get less than \$60 per month. More than 10,000 teachers are paid less than the mean legal minimum for female juveniles in industry.
