#### Christmas Plum Pudding

A pudding, served with hard sauce or aflame with brandy sauce is the preachers and missionaries by the tens traditional Christmas dessert. This one we give here is particularly good.

1 9-ounce pkg. dry mincemeat

'- cup water

's cup strong coffee 2 tablespoons butter

12 cup brown sugar

1's cups soft bread crumbs

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon cinnamon terspoon cloves

'a teaspoon nutmeg I cup seeded raisins

Break mincement into pieces; water and cook slowly, stirring constantly until all lumps are broken up. Bring to a brisk boil and boil for three minutes or until mixture is nearly dry. Add coffee infusion and cool. Cream together butter and sugar; add beaten eggs, blending thoroughly. Add bread crumbs, baking powder, spices and raisins. Fold cooled mincement into above mixture; pour into a well greased pudding mold, filling it 2-3 full. Cover tightly and steam 15 hours. Turn pudding out of mold,
