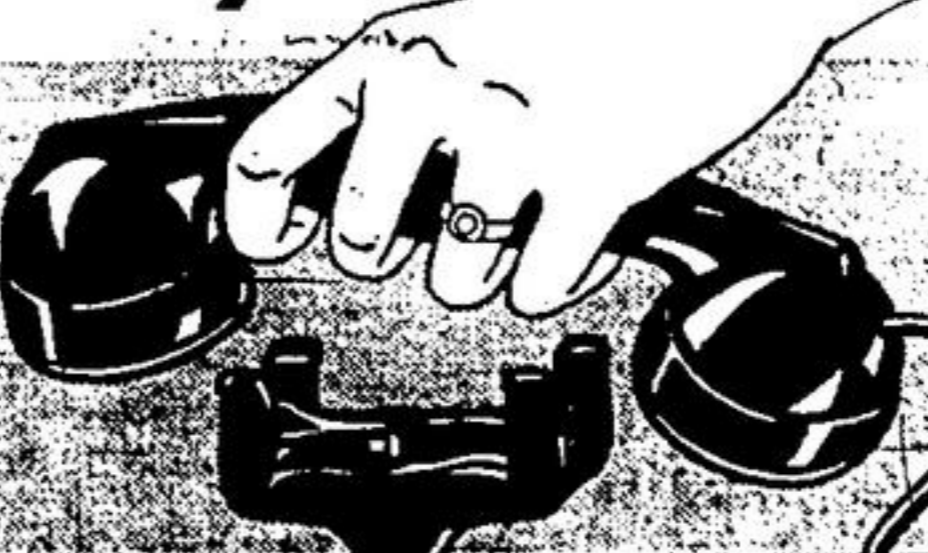

ACTON

Mr. and Mrs. J. Leishman left on Monday for a holiday trip in Florida. Mr. Murray Smith had the misfortune to have his hand caught in a machine at the Beardmore plant on Tuesday, and suffered painful injuries. Last week Councillor G. W. Murray sold a two-year-old thoroughbred Shorthorn heifer, Blythwood Lady, for a good figure, to go to the Agricultural College at Quebec. Council discussed the purchase of a fire pump. The Clerk was instructed to notify the Fire Brigade that Council had considered the purchase of this equipment when making their estimates, but nothing would be done until spring or such time as demonstrations of equipment would be made. An optional plan was discussed of hiring a truck to supplement the present equipment. Yes, bass fishing is out of season, but when the water got low at the plant of Beardmore and Co. workmen investigated and examined the screen on the flume at Fairy Lake. They found the intake clogged with fish. The ice was cut away and frozen fish were cleaned from the screen, and it is estimated 500 fish, most of them bass, were thrown on the bank before the opening was clear and the flow of water was back to normal. It was certainly a great catch.—Free Press
