

Most of these unfavourable conditions may be eliminated or at least greatly reduced where the farmer is well equipped with knowledge as to how best to meet them. This is perticularly true where changes are contemplated in crop and animal production, but even every-day farm practice may be greatly improved through the application of the latest and most complete information available. Outof-date and incomplete information is

just as dangerous as half-truths. Agricultural acientists, experimentalists, and research. men have for years been working to supply the farmers with the latest and most useful information possible on all phases of agricultural production. Such information is insurance against many production risks, and may be secured free at any time on request to the Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agriculture, Agricultural Colleges, or the nearest Experimental Farm or Station.
